SEEKING STUDENTS

SHARP is a 12-week summer mentored internship & learning experience designed to inspire students from underrepresented communities to pursue further studies and careers in public health research.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- Hands-on experience conducting a research project matched to interns' interests.
- One-on-one mentoring from experienced researcher.
- Exposure to career options in scientific research and public health.
- Networking & social events with other SHARP scholars, students and researchers.
- Seminars led by internationally recognized experts in HIV/AIDS research.
- Workshops on conducting research that respects participants and communities.
- Example projects include identifying factors that promote resiliency among transgender youth, assessing technologies to improve medication adherence, and exploring the relationship between migration, social networks, and HIV risk.

BASIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Enrolled in undergraduate or community college certificate program
- Legally eligible to work in the U.S.

PROGRAM DETAILS:

- Internship begins in June & ends in August, 2014
- Based at San Francisco Department of Public Health
- Participating scholars will receive a stipend

We strongly encourage individuals who are of color, have physical or mental disabilities, come from disadvantaged backgrounds, or who identify as transgender, lesbian, gay, or bisexual (LGBT) to apply.
